National professional qualifications (NPQs) are a suite of qualifications designed to support the professional development of teachers and school leaders at all levels. They equip teachers with the expertise to lead sustainable improvement across their schools. They are prestigious professional qualifications, already widely recognised by the sector.

The new NPQs have been developed in collaboration with teachers, school leaders, academics, and an expert advisory group. The frameworks have been independently validated by the Education Endowment Foundation to ensure that they are rooted in evidence, and that they establish a 'golden thread' from initial teacher training and the Early Career Framework through to senior leadership.

Programme structure

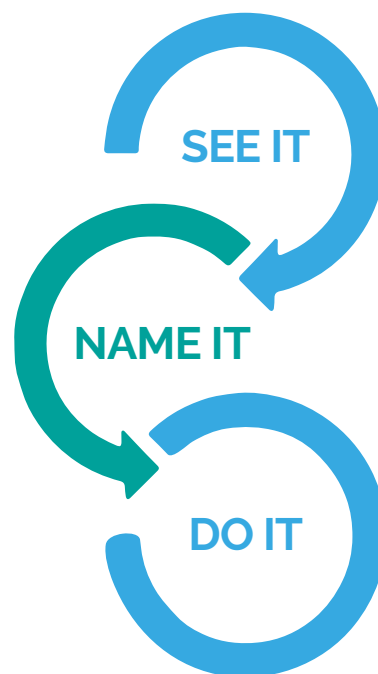
We use the 'see it, name it, do it' as a highly personalised approach developed to scaffold learning to the point of mastery. Its aim is to give a highly applied and personalised approach to professional development.

The NPQs will give participants the opportunity to look beyond the theory (see it) and identify next steps for improving their practice (name it). Finally, there are opportunities through planning and practice giving teachers the best chance of successfully implementing their learning in school (do it).

See it – the approach goes beyond theory by using current, real-life models of exemplary practice.

Name it – by identifying features of exemplary practice, the invisible is made visible. Participants reflect on their current practice and name their 'gaps'.

Do it – participants are guided through implementation planning with time for practice, peer feedback and the use of gap tasks. As part of formative assessment participants then 'fix their gaps' by applying their learning in school.



How are the NPQs assessed?

Throughout each of the programmes there are formative assessments covering a range of methods from short quizzes to facilitator feedback and reflections with a coach. These will focus on professional development and growth.

For each programme there is an 'open book' test based on a relevant school-centred scenario. Participants will have eight days to provide a 1500-word answer showing their understanding of the relevant framework and their ability to apply their learning from the programme. The scenario will consist of a short explanation of the school's circumstances, together with a set of appropriate documents such as policies and data, from which the participant will propose a solution to the issue identified. To prepare for the assessment, scenario-based activities are included throughout the programme.

How we will support you

We support you with each stage of the application process and programme delivery. A facilitator will deliver the qualification both face to face and online; they will be available to support you during your studies. You will also be assigned a mentor/coach who will provide guidance and feedback specific to you. During your NPQ you will have access to online resources and discussions platforms where you will be able to network with your peers for support and advice.

NPQ Leading Behaviour and Culture

This NPQ is for teachers who have influence over the school culture, and support those with complex needs, as well as professional development and implementation. The programme aims to empower participants to:

Create a culture of high expectations, professional learning and continuous improvement across the school

Support the development of a positive, predictable and safe environment for pupils

Support pupils who need more intensive support with their behaviour, and present

If you are currently working as a head of year or are responsible for well-being and behaviour this NPQ will further embed your work and enhance your knowledge.

Programme overview and commitment

The programme is designed to fit around you, your current commitments, and offer a flexible work/life balance while you study. The NPQ Behaviour and Culture is a 12-month commitment with ongoing support from facilitators, mentors/coaches and the programme manager.

The programme is designed to be delivered both face to face and online over three terms. Delivery of the NPQLBC will be a blend of in-person, online and self-study components totalling a maximum of four days plus self-study. Contribute to a whole school approach to creating a positive, predictable and safe classroom environment, and assisting pupils who need more intensive support

Contribute to establishing and sustaining a strategic direction and effective culture across the school

Create effect systems, processes and policies which contribute to the safety of pupils and colleagues, and the proper management of resources

If you are currently an assistant head, associate head, head of department, subject coordinator, or head of year, and are aspiring to be a Senior Leader with cross-school responsibilities, this NPQ will give you additional skills to progress to the next phase of your career.

The programme is designed to fit around you, your current commitments, and offer a flexible work/life balance while you study. The NPQ Senior Leadership is an 18-month commitment with ongoing support from facilitators, mentors/coaches and the programme manager.

Establish effective planning and preparation across the school, ensuring that teaching stimulates pupil thinking and understanding

If you are currently working as a head teacher with responsibility for a singular school or a group of school, or aspire to be an executive head, then this NPQ will give you additional skills and guidance to flourish in your role.
